

Cookie Policy

This Cookie Policy describes how Aiolos Bio, Inc. (“**Aiolos Bio**”), uses and shares cookies, pixel tags, web beacons, and other digital tracking technologies on:

- our website at aiolosbio.com and other websites where this Cookie Policy is posted (collectively, the “**Site**”); and
- the services, software, applications, plug-ins, components, functionality, html-formatted emails, or programs provided or offered now or in the future (collectively, the “**Services**”).

Throughout this Cookie Policy, “**you**” or “**your**” shall refer to any person or entity using the Site, Services, or App, and “**we**,” “**our**” or “**us**” will refer collectively to Aiolos Bio.

Please note that by using the Site or Services, you agree to the terms in this Cookie Policy. If you choose not to agree to the terms in this Cookie Policy, please do not use the Site or Services.

This Cookie Policy may change from time to time. If we change this Cookie Policy, we will update the “Last modified” date above and provide a notice about the update on the Site. Continued use of the Site or any Services after the effective date of a Cookie Policy change will constitute your acceptance of those changes.

Information Automatically Collected; Cookies; Tags. When you use the Site, or our Services, we may collect information about you and your computer or device, including through the use of both session and persistent “cookies,” “pixel tags,” or “web beacons” (collectively, “**Tags**”). “Cookies” are small data files stored on your hard drive, and “pixel tags” or “web beacons” are small graphic files placed on a website or within the body of an email for the purpose of tracking activity on websites, or when emails are opened or accessed. A “session” Tag will not collect information once you close the program used to access the Tag (e.g., a web browser), and a persistent Tag will collect information until it is deleted.

The type of information we automatically collect through Tags when you use our Site or Services includes the IP (Internet Protocol) address of your computer or device; location data; information about other Tags on your computer or device; the website you visited before visiting our Site; pages you viewed on our Site; how long you spent accessing each page; how long you used an App; times and dates that you accessed the Site or used our Services; your computer or device type; your computer or device operating system type; browser type; browser language; and other information about how you used or accessed the Site or our Services.

You can typically block, remove, or reject Tags with your browser or media-device settings. Many browsers and media-devices are set to accept Tags unless you change your settings. If you block, remove or reject our Tags, it could affect how our Site works for you, and portions of our Site may become difficult to use or inoperable.

We also use Google Analytics to understand how the Site is being used and the demographics of who is using the Site. Google Analytics uses permanent cookies on your web browser to identify you as a

unique user. This information does not identify you personally: please see Google's privacy policy for more information on how such data is collected and shared by Google, as well as how to opt-out of Google Analytic Tags at [Google Analytics](#).

Use of Tags. We use Tags and Tag-associated information to remember information you enter online, including your preferences and settings; to keep you logged-in to your account; to generate aggregate statistics about how people use our Site or Services; for troubleshooting; and to improve your experience using our Site or Services.

We may also use, and disclose to select partners, the Tags and Tag-associated information that we collect about you, including IP address and location data, for targeted advertisement purposes. Targeted advertisements are digital advertisements that appear on your browser or device in order to market information, products, or services to you based on the Tags and Tag-associated information that are collected from your computer or device. You can remove Tags from your browser, computer, or device if you want to stop targeted advertisements based on the Tags already present, but to stop all targeted advertisements, you will need to block them according to your browser's or each advertisement platform's targeted advertisement opt-out rules.
